







Interest and activities concerning Non-Wood Forest Products (NWFPs) have been renewed worldwide during the last two decades as NWFPs contribute to the livelihood of rural people as well as provide crucial ecosystem services. Attempts have been done to domesticate these species and induct them into farming systems to reduce pressure on natural populations. This offers scientific, economic and social challenges to the biologists and has a bearing on sustainable use of NWFPs. Garcinia species are regarded as most important NWFPs of the Western Ghats because of their strong traditional use, value-added commercial products as well as due to their internationally recognized pharmaceutical properties.

Keeping this in the background, University of Agricultural Sciences, Dharwad and ICAR under auspicious of UNDP/GEF project on "Conservation and Sustainable use of cultivated and wild tropical fruit diversity: promoting sustainable livelihoods, food security, and ecosystem services" and in collaboration with National Medicinal Plant Board, New Delhi is organizing a National Symposium on Garcinia resources at College of Forestry, Sirsi, Karnataka during May 8th and 9th, 2010. The organizers cordially invite researchers, growers, industrialists, extension specialists, policy makers and marketing personnel who are engaged in Garcinia research and NwFF in general. A strong scientific discussion will be held with invited speakers. The symposium also aims to celebrate International Year of Biodiversity (IYB2010) and raise the public awareness on conservation and sustainable use of Garcina.
